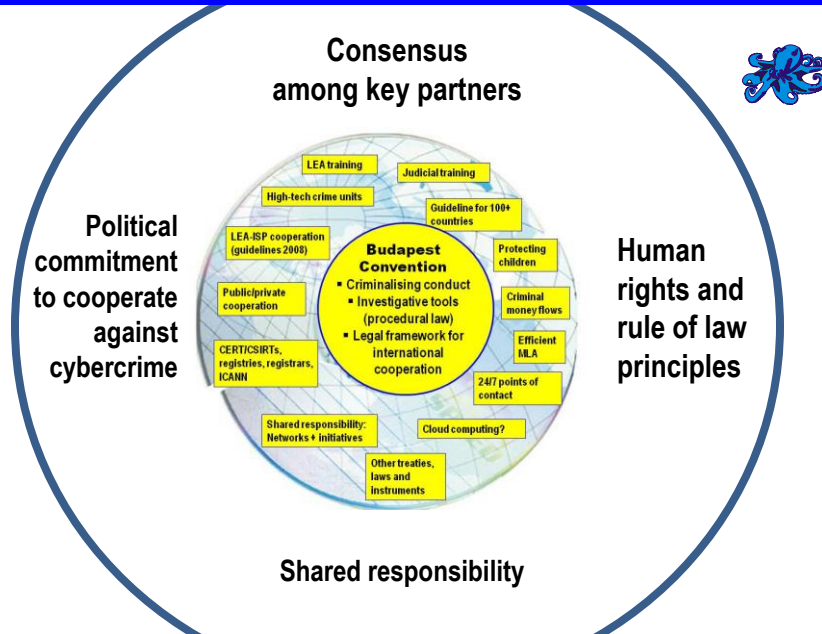

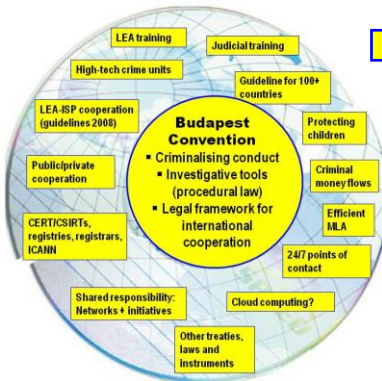

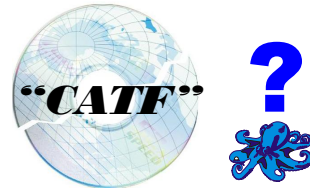
Need for a global capacity building effort
